ICCM improves access for hard-to-reach populations by deploying community health workers to manage Malaria among other prioritized killer diseases. The incumbent will be responsible for prioritization of populations and areas that are hardest to reach, and implement community health interventions under the USAID PMI Tanzania Case Management Activity project in a comprehensive manner with quality and equitable coverage, guided by national policy and local systems to ensure impact.

The Ministry of Health (MoH) provides leadership in the overall policy process and overarching co-ordination. Implementing organizations play a supportive role including financial sustainability of iCCM. The project will provide technical assistance to the Government of the United Republic of Tanzania and facilitate implementation of iCCM.

Key Responsibilities

Under the supervision of the Technical Advisor for Case management and Malaria in Pregnancy (MIP) and in line with USAID and PSI policies, the implementation will follow CHWs and iCCM national guidelines. The iCCM coordinator will be responsible for:

- Collaboration with implementing partners in planning to positively impact on community acceptance and ownership;
- Facilitate CHWs capacity building on iCCM of Malaria;
- Development of iCCM of Malaria support supervision;
- Engagement in full integration of community level data into the health management information system and emphasizing data analysis, use and feedback at all levels;
- Facilitate strengthened supply chains through improved quantification in conjunction with the national distribution network;
- Facilitate stakeholder's engagement to establish a support system for CHWs in order to increase their motivation;
- Enhanced sensitization and behaviour change communication to raise awareness and usage of appropriate iCCM related health services;
- Advocacy at the national forums for funding and logistical support for the continuation and integration of iCCM including the mechanisms for channeling funding flows.

Your contribution

The Surveillance Officer will be responsible for implementing strategies to assist Zanzibar Malaria Elimination Program (ZAMEP) in strengthening and expanding Malaria Surveillance systems in Zanzibar. In addition, the Surveillance Officer will coordinate capacity building efforts to strengthen capabilities for evidence-based decision making and use for surveillance systems to improve malaria elimination programming.

Key responsibilities:

Under the supervision of the Malaria Surveillance and Epidemiology Officer (S&EO) and in line with USAID and PSI policies, the Malaria Surveillance officer will be responsible for:

- Provide coordination for the implementation of input on issues related to improving routine malaria surveillance, and in situation where applicable, working with the ZAMEP to facilitate rapid malaria case detection and response capabilities.
- Coordinate the implementation of strategies to assist the ZAMEP in strengthening and expanding Malaria surveillance systems In Zanzibar, tailored to epidemiological setting;
- Facilitate ZAMEP data analysis and timely submission of project deliverable for surveillance activities as requested.
- Provide inputs into ZAMEP Case management and entomological reports related to Malaria surveillance and response activities with particular focus on their key tasks and the quality of projects deliverables.
- Coordinate across key stakeholders to ensure that surveillance systems are responsive to different epidemiological settings.
- Coordinate capacity building efforts at ZAMEP, district and community levels to improve the ability to report, analyze, visualize, and use surveillance to make evidence-based decisions to improve malaria programs;
- Coordinate with the ZAMEP Entomology unit and entomology local partners to ensure entomological monitoring is included in surveillance systems and data is used for decision making;

- Facilitate a culture of learning and data use for ZAMEP and local partners in multiple forums including routine meeting to reflect on and use data to inform decisions;
- Support the development of success stories and lessons learned related to Malaria surveillance systems;
- Maintain close working relationship with the surveillance staff at ZAMEP;

What are we looking for?

- Master's degree in public health, demography, epidemiology, biostatistics, or a related discipline.
- A minimum five years or more of experience in malaria disease surveillance and monitoring public systems. Excellent knowledge of data collection protocols for quality data collection and verification. Experience in aspects of collection and analyzing health data.
